METHODOLOGY



QUANTITATIVE RESEARCH INSTRUMENT

An online survey of 1584 Canadians (n=1385 drivers) was completed between September 27-30 2019, using Leger's online panel.


The margin of error for this study was +/-2.5%, 19 times out of 20.



THREE-QUARTERS SAY THEIR VEHICLE IS EQUIPPED WITH WINTER TIRES DURING THE WINTER SEASON; 23% DO NOT.



Three-quarters (75%) of Canadian drivers say they equip their vehicle with winter tires during the winter season, with those in Quebec and the Atlantic provinces significantly more likely to do so compared to the rest of Canada. Of the one-quarter (23%) who do not use winter tires, half (51%) say it is because they feel their all-season tires are good enough to get them through the winter weather, while two-in-ten say it is because they do not drive very much during the winter (18%), or that winter tires are too expensive (17%).



ONE-THIRD OF DRIVERS WHO USE WINTER TIRES SAY THEY HAVE USED THEM FOR 5 YEARS OR LESS.




One-third (33%) of Canadian drivers, who say they drive a vehicle equipped with winter tires, say they've been doing so for 5 years or less, with younger drivers and the rest of Canada (vs. Quebec) significantly more likely to say this. Similar to 2018, two-thirds (64%) have been driving with winter tires for 6 or more years, with nearly half (47%) saying they have been using winter tires on their vehicles for 11 or more years.



MAJORITY SAY THAT DRIVING A VEHICLE EQUIPPED WITH WINTER TIRES HAS SAVED THEM FROM A HAZARDOUS INCIDENT




Eight-in-ten (80%) Canadian drivers who drive a car equipped with winter tires say that their winters have saved them from being involved in a potentially hazardous driving situation. Quebecers are significantly more likely to believe that winter tires on their vehicle have saved them from being involved in an incident. Those driving with winter tires on their vehicle for 11 or more years (vs <11 years) are significantly more likely to say that they believe driving with winter tires has saved them from being involved in a potentially hazardous driving situation.



MOST HAVE THEIR TIRES CHANGES IN THE SPRING AND FALL; SIX-IN-TEN USE A PROFESSIONAL SERVICE.



The majority (90%) of Canadian drivers, who drive a vehicle equipped with winter tires, change over their winter tires in the spring and fall, with 63% using a professional service to do this, and one-quarter (26%) doing it themselves or with a friend or family member. Quebecers are significantly more likely to say they do change over their tires (94% vs. 88% RoC), either by a professional or not.
