METHODOLOGY



QUANTITATIVE RESEARCH INSTRUMENT

An online survey of 1524 Canadian motorists was completed between October 12-15 2018, using Leger's online panel. The margin of error for this study was +/-2.5%, 19 times out of 20.

ABOUT LEGER'S ONLINE PANEL

Leger's online panel has approximately 400,000 members nationally and has a retention rate of 90%.




THREE-QUARTERS OF CANADIANS OWN WINTER TIRES



Three-quarters (76%) of Canadians who drive own winter tires, a significant increase from 2017. Atlantic and Quebec residents who drive, are significantly more likely than the rest of the country to own them (97% vs. 67%). Canadians under 55 are significantly more likely to say they own winter tires (79% vs. 72% among those age 55+).

Among the 23% of Canadian drivers who do not own winter tires, more than half (53%) feel that their all-season tires are good enough, this is a significant increase from 2017, where 41% said 'all season tires are good enough'.



TWO-THIRDS OF WINTER TIRE OWNERS HAVE OWNED WINTER TIRES FOR 6 OR MORE YEARS




Two-thirds (65%) of Canadians with winter tires have been driving with winter tires for six or more years, particularly Quebec drivers. Younger winter tire owners (age 18-34) are significantly more likely to have been driving with them for five years or less, while winter tire owners age 55+ have been driving with winter tires for longer. Urban drivers who own winter tires, are significantly more likely to say they have been driving with winter tires for five or less years (41% vs. 27% suburban vs. 23% rural).



THE MOTIVATION TO OWN WINTER TIRES IS VARIED




One-third (34%) of Canadians who own winter tires, say their main motivation for purchasing winter tires is 'it is a mandatory requirement in their province'. Winter tire owners in Quebec and British Columbia are significantly more likely to say this is their motivation. Ontario winter tire owners, are significantly more likely to say that lower premiums offered by their insurance provider is their incentive to own winter tires (27% vs. 2% other provinces), as well as drivers living in urban or suburban communities (12% vs. 6% rural).



EIGHT-IN-TEN WINTER TIRE OWNERS FEEL THAT WINTER TIRES HAVE SAVED THEM FROM A HAZARDOUS DRIVING SITUATION



The majority (80%) of winter tire owners believe that driving a vehicle equipped with winter tires has saved them from being involved in a potentially hazardous driving situation, such as loss of control or a collision. Younger winter tire owners (age 18-34 vs. 35+) and Atlantic Canadians (vs all other provinces) are significantly more likely to believe that driving a vehicle equipped with winter tires has saved them from being involved in a potentially hazardous driving situation.
