#### **METHODOLOGY**



#### QUANTITATIVE RESEARCH INSTRUMENT

An online survey of n=1607 drivers was completed between 21<sup>st</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> of October, using Leger's online panel.

No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (i.e. a web panel in this case). For comparative purposes, though, a probability sample of 1835 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.4%, 19 times out of 20.

Where applicable, significant changes from previous research is indicated.



#### ABOUT LEGER'S ONLINE PANEL

Leger's online panel has approximately 400,000 members nationally and has a retention rate of 90%.



Significantly higher

Nearly three-quarters (70%) of Canadian drivers say they equip their vehicle with winter tires during the winter season, with 4% of those saying 2022/23 will be the first winter season they'll be using them.

Of the 27% who do not use winter tires, the main reason (for 57%) remains a belief that all-season tires are good enough to get them through the winter weather, while fewer say it is that winter tires are too expensive (26%) or because they do not drive very much during the winter (25%). One-in-ten don't have a place to store the off-season tires (10%).

#### Safety is the number one reason for purchase/use of winter tires.

Three-quarters (76%) say their top reason to purchase and use winter tires is because they are protecting their family with the safety advantages of winter tires, (i.e. enhanced traction, cornering, and stopping power in cold weather), significantly higher than the 66% who chose this reason in 2021. Four-in-ten (38%) say their primary reason for having winter tires is because they are mandatory in their province, significantly so in Quebec, BC, and Atlantic Canada. Two-in-ten (21%) cite lower auto insurance premiums offered by their insurance provider as a reason to buy winter tires, (most likely among Ontarians). About one-in-ten say they acted on advice from family and friends (13% - almost half as likely among Quebecers) and advice from tire retailers (7%).


## The majority say that driving a car with winter tires has saved them from being involved in a serious road incident.

Three-quarters (76%) Canadian drivers who have a car equipped with winter tires say they believe their winter tires have saved them from being involved in a potentially hazardous driving situation such as loss of control or a collision. Quebecers are significantly more likely to believe that winter tires on their vehicle have saved them from being involved in an accident compared to the rest of Canada.




## The majority (82%) agree that winter tires are an important investment despite the rising cost of living...

...and in fact, 48% <u>strongly</u> agree with this statement, especially among Quebecers (vs. the rest of Canada). Levels of agreement about the importance of investing in winter tires is particularly strong among Canadians whose vehicles are equipped with winter tires, and those who believe having their vehicle equipped with winter tires has saved them from being involved in a potentially hazardous driving situation such as loss of control or a collision




## Six-in-ten (58%) have their tires changed over in the spring and fall by a professional; 29% do it themselves.

Those in BC and Manitoba are significantly more likely to be among the 7% who do not change over in the spring and fall because they use all-weather tires.



## The majority (84%) are driving on winter tires that are less than five years old; 13% just purchased them this year.

Four-in-ten (41%) have winter tires on their vehicle that are 1-2 years old and 30% say their tires are approximately 3-4 years old. Just 11% have their vehicles equipped with tires that are 5 years old or more. There are few demographic differences here, however drivers in BC are significantly more likely to be driving on newer tires than those in Manitoba or Ontario.


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
